# Living with MS

## Vaccines

Vaccines come up at this time of year and we wanted to remind our patients of the vaccination recommendations for people with MS. The American Academy of Neurology has reviewed the available scientific evidence on infections and vaccine use in MS and published their guidelines. #### **Key Messages:**

- Preventing infections through vaccination is a key part of medical care for people with MS.
- People with MS should receive vaccines according to standard vaccine guidelines
- Before receiving any vaccine, talk with your MS provider

## Specific Vaccines:

- 2019-2020 Seasonal Flu Vaccine
  - o It is recommended that people with MS receive the influenza vaccine annually, unless there is a specific reason not to such as a prior severe reaction.
- Hepatitis B Vaccine
  - o MS experts and the National Academy of Sciences Institute of Medicine determined the vaccine does not cause MS to occur and is safe for people with MS.
- Pneumonia Vaccine
  - Both pneumonia vaccines (PCV13 and PPSV23) are inactivated and safe for people with MS. It is recommended that adults 65 years or older receive one dose of each vaccine at least a year apart.
- Shingles Vaccine
  - O Shingrix, a non-live vaccine, is recommended instead of Zostavax.
- Chickenpox Vaccine
  - The Varicella vaccine should be considered by people with MS who have never had chickenpox.
- Tetanus Vaccine
  - This vaccine is inactivated and considered safe for people with MS.
- MMR Vaccine
  - The MMR vaccine is a live-attenuated vaccine so depending on your MS medication may not be recommended but with the rise of Measles cases you should discuss with your MS provider.

# **Special Considerations**

- Live and live-attenuated vaccines are sometimes recommended but cannot be given during or after certain MS medications so always check with your provider.
- Vaccines should be delayed until 4-6 weeks after the onset of a relapse.
- Several MS medications require that you receive vaccinations several weeks before starting the therapy
